In 2005, colleagues and students of TU Wien were invited to take part in a Creative Europe project entitled Cultures of Living. What began as an exchange of ideas on housing and architectural culture between Europe and Indonesia became the starting point of a long-term academic partnership.

When the devastating earthquake and tsunami struck at the end of 2004, the project focus shifted towards the joint design of transitional shelters for the affected regions. This cooperation between educators and students laid the foundation for two decades of successful collaboration in research, teaching, and cultural exchange — continuing to this day.

We would like to commemorate this anniversary with a celebration during the Conference on Cultural Heritage and New Technologies (CHNT) in November 2025, held in cooperation with Trisakti University (Jakarta), Institut Seni Indonesia Yogyakarta, and Universitas Sumatera Utara (Medan).

All colleagues, former participants, and friends of the joint programmes are warmly invited to join us in celebrating

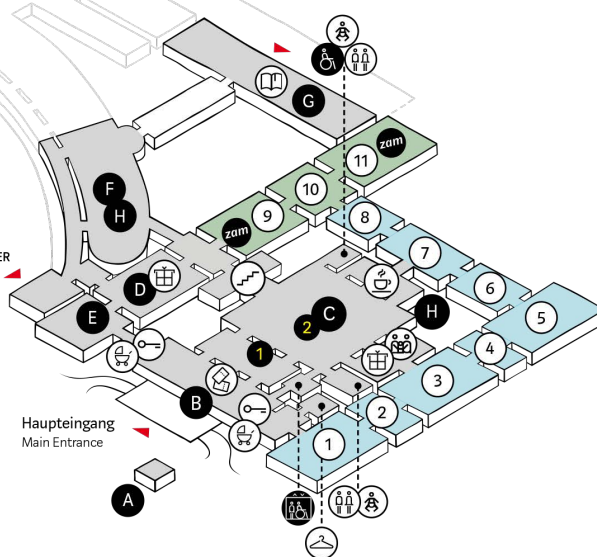
