

Judith Bovensiepen is the Director of the Institute for Social Anthropology at the Austrian Academy of Sciences and Honorary Professor at the Institute for Social and Cultural Anthropology at the University of Vienna. Her research focusses on island Southeast Asia, specifically Timor-Leste, where she has been carrying out ethnographic research since 2005. Bovensiepen's first book, [*The Land of Gold: Post-Conflict Recovery and Cultural Revival*](#) (Cornell University Press), examines the role of the spiritual landscape in processes of post-conflict recovery. She is currently completing her second monograph, provisionally entitled *Oil and Animism: Extractive Encounters in Post-Revolutionary Timor-Leste*, which explores how animist practices – based on logics that would appear to undermine extractivism – are incorporated into the circuits extraction. Bovensiepen also leads an ERC project, entitled '[Resource Spirits](#)', which involves a comparative study of resource extraction in Southeast Asia.
